



HOW TO CREATE POSITIVE INDIGENOUS YOUTH CONSULTATION PROCESSES?

ENGAGE in an Indigenous-led process with community actors and partners grounded in the diverse realities of Indigenous youth's lived experiences.

CREATE safe spaces by attending to the physical and relational aspects of the consultation process.

This means being flexible, going to where the youth are, on their terms.

Be inclusive of languages and cultural practices and allow for alternative forms of expression.

Build and maintain trust by being transparent on the purpose and outcomes throughout the process.

INSPIRE youth to support each other in becoming contributing members of their communities.

Provide a positive experience for youth where they feel listened to and heard.

Meaningfully recognize their voices. This ongoing consultation process should support youth and community agency and foster a sense of belonging.

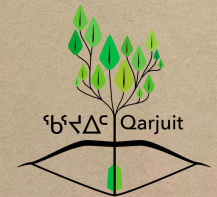
“There is no end, a youth strategy is always evolving”
